### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

It was great to speak to parents, carers and Year II students in person last week at our Sixth Form Information Evenings. These evenings provided an opportunity for parents and students to learn more about the Sixth Form, hear from our two Head Girls about their experiences as well as listen to advice on how best to choose their A level options and also be taken through changes to this year's GCSE examinations. Thank you to everyone who attended and I hope that you found it all useful.

I am pleased to report that the number of confirmed Covid cases in the school currently remain low, however, this does not mean that we can afford to be complacent. Please refer to the letter sent to all parents and students last night outlining the new national measures in relation to Covid-19. This means that, in line with the government guidance, students at Wallington High School for Girls should now wear face masks in communal areas, such as corridors and the school canteen (except for those that have a mask exemption). We have also now decided to suspend face to face year group assemblies for the remainder of this term as an additional precautionary measure.

With the colder weather and the increased importance on good ventilation around the school, please can students ensure that they have a coat with them as inevitably classrooms and other areas are less warm than usual.

Secondary schools were notified on Friday by the DfE to prepare to test their pupils once on-site on their return in lanuary after the Christmas holidays. As we have only just received the news, further details will be sent out to parents once we have had a chance to determine arrangements.

Finally, with the arrival of the colder weather, I thought it might be sensible to remind parents of the protocols following an unexpected closure of the School due to severe weather. Such events are extremely rare and the School would only be closed reluctantly and as a last resort. Every effort will be made to maintain the continuous operation of the School and the education of its students. Any full or partial closure will be communicated to parents and staff by mobile text and by email around 07.00am. There will also be a message on the school's website.

### Students' Medication at School

lf а student has а condition that requires any medication including Inhalers, Epi-pens or Antihistamines can parents/carers please ensure that they provide spare medication to the school so that we can hold this in our first aid room in case of emergency. We require all medication each to be accompanied by a completed Parental Permission Form. available from the school website by this link:

We would also ask that you would provide the school with replacement medication as and when the expiry date is reached.

### **Reminder - First Aid Room**

A reminder that the first aid room is primarily for emergencies and students should only ask to visit if they are in genuine need of medical attention. For minor ailments such as headaches and period pain, there isn't much that First Aid can do to assist. Please try to be proactive before you arrive at school making sure that you are eating a good breakfast, drinking lots of water and taking painkillers at home with adult supervision if required so that you are prepared for the day. If you do need to visit First Aid and you are in a lesson please do ask for an Out of Lesson Pass or ensure that you get your planner signed by a member of staff.

### **TESTING FOR COVID-19**

Please be reminded that Lateral Flow Tests should be taken twice weekly if a student does not have any Covid-19 symptoms. If symptoms start to show e.g. new persistent cough, even if they are also presenting with cold/flu symptoms, a PCR test should be arranged, and they should stay home until results have been received and notified to our Attendance Officers for a return to school date.



## Section 4 – Team Question


### Time: 5 minutes

### Calculators are <u>not allowed</u> for this question.

The  $2 \times 2$  grid below is to have one digit (from 0 to 9 inclusive) placed in each of its four cells to form four 2-digit numbers (two horizontal and two vertical).

The grid sum is defined to be the sum of these four 2-digit numbers.

For example,



both have grid sum equal to 50 + 15 + 51 + 5 = 121.

Your task is to find as many ways to fill a  $2 \times 2$  grid as possible which give a grid sum of 100.

Can you find any?


## **Brass and Music Theory Lessons**
