We also held our annual Oxbridge Evening last week, which was aimed at Year 11 and Year 12 students interested in learning more about Oxbridge, the ways in which Oxford and Cambridge are different from other universities, the application process as well as dispelling some of the myths associated with both institutions. Thank you to everyone that attended.

The focus for assemblies last week and this week has been safeguarding, and in particular, how we show respect in our school community and how we keep safe in the wider community. A copy of this assembly is being sent out to parents once it has been delivered to each year group so that if parents wish, they can discuss it with their daughters. Hopefully everyone will have seen and read my Covid update last week. We continue to monitor and manage confirmed cases. These include the expectation that students in these year groups are wearing masks in classrooms and corridors as was the suspension of extra-curricular activities and assemblies for the next two weeks (again this just applies to these year groups). Hopefully these measures will help to reduce the number of new cases and as always, thank you to parents and students for their support and co-operation.

Finally, a reminder that this Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> October is an INSET day. Staff will be receiving training from Stop Hate, one of the UK's leading national organisations working to challenge all forms of Hate Crime and discrimination, based on any aspect of an individual's identity.

## NEW CATERING CARDS

## PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Please can I remind parents and carers that we enjoy a cordial relationship with our neighbours. Please be considerate if parking on the road especially when dropping off or collecting your daughter. We ask that you do not block entrances, exits, garages or park in a way that will cause them inconvenience. Please do not block the staff entrances to the school. Unless your daughter is ill and you have been called to collect her from school or you hold a permit from ourselves, there is absolutely no dropping off or parking on school premises. Please remind your daughters to be vigilant at all times when entering and leaving the school and to be mindful of her own safety—there is a great deal of traffic around the school at all times but especially at the beginning and end of the school day.

## STUDENTS' MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

If a student has a condition that requires any medication including Inhalers, Epi-pens or Antihistamines can parents/carers please ensure that they provide spare medication to the school so that we can hold this in our first aid room in case of emergency. We require all medication each to be accompanied by a completed Parental Permission Form, available from the school website by this link:


