#### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

We have now had our second week of Black History month activities, organised by our EDI prefects and Afro-Caribbean society (ACS). Last week Year 7 students took part in a scavenger hunt at lunchtime to learn more about important black figures from history and this week Year 8 students participated in a dance workshop. We also sent some students to the Sutton Youth Summit last Thursday where they were given a platform to discuss issues around justice as well as having the opportunity to network with other students in the borough. We look forward to hearing more about their experiences in a future assembly. This week we have also seen the first book club take place - where students came together over hot chocolate and cookies to discuss 'Ace of Spades' by Faridah Àbíké-Íyímídé and a movie nights last Friday. We are looking forward to our next movie night, book clubs, Y10 video showcase and Y11 poetry slam next week, with the finale of Black History Month being a mufti day next Friday.

Reminder -First Aid Room

A reminder that the first aid room is primarily for emergencies and students should only ask to visit if they are in genuine need of medical attention. For minor ailments such as headaches and period pain, there isn't much that First Aid can do to assist. Please try to be proactive before you arrive at school making sure that you are eating a good breakfast, drinking lots of water and taking painkillers at home with adult supervision if required so that you are prepared for the day. If you do need to visit First Aid and you are in a lesson please do ask for a Staff Pass or ensure that you get your planner signed by a member of staff.

Testing for Covid-19 – Please be reminded that Lateral Flow Tests should be taken twice weekly if a student does not have any Covid-19 symptoms. If symptoms start to show e.g. new persistent cough, even if they are also presenting with cold/flu symptoms, a PCR test should be arranged, and they should stay home until a negative result has been received.

# PARKING AROUND THE SCHOOL

Please can I remind parents and carers that we enjoy a cordial relationship with our neighbours. Please be considerate if parking on the road especially when dropping off or collecting your daughter. We ask that you do not block entrances, exits, garages or park in a way that will cause them inconvenience. Please do not block the staff entrances to the school. Unless your daughter is ill and you have been called to collect her from school or you hold a permit from ourselves, there is absolutely no dropping off or parking on school premises. Please remind your daughters to be vigilant at all times when entering and leaving the school and to be mindful of her own safety—there is a great deal of traffic around the school at all times but especially at the beginning and end of the school day.

This will help greatly in supporting our Attendance Officer prioritise the relevant emails.


### **AUTUMN/WINTER WEATHER**





English Literature KS3 / GCSE: Poets in Person Six short films, each celebrating a different contemporary poem and featuring performances and personal insights from the poets themselves.






Ritangle is a competition designed for teams of students aged 16-18 who are currently studying either:
