Thanks so much to all of you that joined in the Enrichment day events across all the years. Your behaviour and enthusiasm made it a lovely day for all WHSG staff who were involved and for the staff involved in liaising with us at the various locations.

We really hope that you all had a brilliant enrichment day, providing you with the opportunity to undertake a deeper dive into elements of your curriculum or via any of the personal skills and development days.

Year 7 Students took part in a disability awareness day where they were able to enhance their understanding of the world around them; students spent the day focusing on disabilities and how they impact individuals and their surroundings. External and internal guest speakers held workshops on the day also.

Year 8 Students visited three different sites in Greenwich; The Cutty Sark, Maritime History Museum and the Royal observatory. This day links in to the History, Science and Technology curriculum. A wonderful day out exploring, a highlight being able to take lovely photographs of students on the deck of the ship.

Year 9 Students took part in a Geography based day. Students visited RHS Wisley to further deepen their understanding of the recent geography Topic biodiversity through examining the variety of habitats displayed at the world-famous gardens.

Year 10 Students spent the day undertaking deeper dives into one of their GCSE topics. These topic-based activities included GCSE Art & Photography visiting the TATE Britain, GCSE Theology and Philosophy had a panel with various church organisations, GCSE History visited the Imperial War Museum and GCSE Science visited the Natural History Museum.

Year 11 Students took part in an English Revision Day. The morning focussed on students watching the play Macbeth delivered by a theatre company and the afternoon provided varied opportunities undertaking English revision sessions.

Year 12 Students undertook sessions based on sexual health, drugs awareness and positive mental health.

Year 13 Students took part in an 'Independent Living Day', learning skills and techniques that will set them up for the next stages in their lives.

The enrichment team will now start planning the Summer Enrichment week for the 19th to 21st July 2022. Keep your

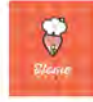
