This is a truly remarkable achievement and means that the RAF section have been crowned national champions in the last three out of five years (with a year off for lockdown). As well as winning the overall trophy they won the Aircraft Recognition and Military Knowledge trophies and were runners up in the drill competition. Needless to say, all of this took a huge amount of additional commitment and effort, including parading an additional night for months as well as organising their own training programme. Huge congratulations go to everyone involved and in particular to the WHSG members of the team - Sgt Garg (Year 12), Lcpl Mircheva (Year II), Lcpl Rajan (Year II) and Cdt Thambiayah (Year 10). Thank you also to Lt Col Burton and all of the Wilson's and Wallington staff involved with CCF.

Yesterday, students enjoyed our second Enrichment Day of the academic year with lots of exciting and interesting events taking place. NATIONAL CHAMPIONS IN THE Royal Air Squadron Trophy Competition

After winning our regional competition a few months earlier, the time had come for our team to once again head to RAF Halton to compete for the National title. Each year the top RAF sections from all over the country compete in the following disciplines: Drill, Military Knowledge, Command task, First Aid, Aircraft recognition and Shooting. The competition was fierce, with 14 other CCF units taking part- all having earnt the top 3 spots in their region. The team, led by CWO Dayal, with the supervising staff (Flt Lt Luck and Lt Col Burton) consisted of 13 Wilson's and WHSG Cadets and NCOs, faced the challenge of being the youngest team the CCF has had to offer- with only a small number of us having been to the competition before. However, we persevered and tackled each discipline one by one. After 8 months of extensive training, our hard work finally pulled off when we were announced national champions! There were tears, applause, cheers and our golden trophy- awarded by the Commandant of the Air Cadets, Air Commodore Tony Keeling. Having achieved our national title, the training for the new team will commence next academic year, with the aim to dominate and proudly shine for years to come.

On Thursday 17th March it is Year 8 Virtual Parents' Evening which begins at 2.00pm.


All Year 8 students will be dismissed from school at the end of period 3, 12.05pm.

CERVANTES THEATRE TRIP A LEVEL SPANISH



On Thursday 3rd March we visited the Cervantes Theatre in London to see 'La Casa de Bernarda Alba'. The play, written by the Spanish playwright Federico García Lorca, is part of our A-Level Spanish specification. Seeing the play in person was invaluable as it allowed us to better understand the plot and core themes as a whole. We took particular interest in the use of lighting by the director Jorge De Juan to represent the increasing oppression and darkness in the play. The intimacy of the layout of the theatre enhanced our experience, as we felt trapped inside the house alongside Bernarda's daughters. Our visit to the Cervantes theatre felt like we had stepped into the theatre district in Madrid, with Spanish music playing and the staff all conversing in Spanish. Overall, it was an enjoyable evening, and one that we would recommend to an aspiring Spanish student.



Our celebration of Sign Language Week will include:







