#### MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

I am glad to be able to share this newsletter with the school now fully open again following the power outage on Thursday evening. Thank you to everyone for being so understanding.

It has been fantastic to see the extra-curricular life of the school flourishing again after the impact of the pandemic and this is very much the theme of my introduction this week. On Wednesday, when I wandered round the school grounds at the end of the day, I was able to see so many after school activities taking place, including football, rugby and netball. Alongside all of this, the Wallington Girls Year I2 Sports Leaders hosted the Sutton Primary school athletics competition on Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> January. 12 schools attended throughout the day, competing in a range of track and field events, with our amazing sixth form leaders scoring, time keeping and leading Year 5/6 through their events. The primary school students were taken aback by our amazing big sports hall and based on the volume of cheering, they all had a great time.

Our Year 7 and 8 Athletes were also competing themselves at the borough Secondary schools athletics competition on Monday. Year 7 finished I<sup>st</sup> place out of the 8 schools attending and now progress to the South London Youth games competition next week. Year 8's came 2<sup>nd</sup> place and narrowly missed out on progressing to the finals. Year 7 and 8 were also busy competing at the Surrey schools netball tournament on Tuesday and again had a fantastic day with lots of successes. Year 7's came 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall competing against some very tough Surrey schools.

Rehearsals have continued in earnest for our school production which this year is 'A Midsummer Night's Dream'. Everyone has been working hard to ensure it is a great production that meets the high standards set in previous years. Performances will take place on Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> March, Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> March and Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> March. ### STUDENT SUCCESS


Riya in Year 11 took part in the 2022 Immerse Education Essay Competition. This was a record-breaking competition that received thousands of entries from students attending leading schools all over the world. Each of the judges commented on the extremely high quality of essays that were received this year across all categories, and it was clear that candidates had invested significant effort in researching and writing their essays. The judges selected Riya's essay to receive a full scholarship (100%) to take part in their Medicine 16-18 summer programme at her university of choice including Oxford, Cambridge or UCL.

Riya's essay was recognised as the highest calibre of entries this year. The full scholarship will cover all of the course fees, which includes half-board accommodation, academic materials and all activities/excursions.

On behalf of our school community here at Wallington High School for Girls we wanted to congratulate Riya for this amazing achievement.

### CATERING UPDATE

### Tariff Change

It has been a challenging year for our catering contract, the hospitality sector has been experiencing food shortages within their supply chain and problems with deliveries, both of which have impacted the school. Despite this the Catering Teams have been working hard not to disrupt the service to our students. However, the combination of these issues combined with inflation, increase in minimum wage and rising energy prices, we have been informed that we will see a 3% increase overall on the tariff prices in the canteen from 22nd February. This increase has been kept to a minimum and has not affected all items sold.

### PLASTIC BOTTLES

As a Trust, we have a responsibility to reduce our plastic waste where possible and one way of doing this is to remove the plastic bottles from the meal deal offer in the canteen. We have asked Aspens to review the meal deals and provide a tariff which excludes the drink option so that students are not encouraged to purchase a plastic bottle. The school has a number of water refilling stations so would like to encourage the students to bring in their own bottle which they can refill throughout the day. There will be a reduced number of drinks available to purchase as a singular item if students do not bring their water bottles.

### MEAL DEALS

As highlighted above, the school asked Aspens to review their Meal Deal to ensure we are offering a more sustainable, value for money lunch. By removing the drink from the Meal Deal, we can now offer two price points for the Meal Deal. These include a 2 food item Meal Deal for  $\underline{f2.30}$  or a 3 food item Meal Deal for  $\underline{f2.50}$ . The attached update outlines what will be included in each of the Meal Deal options and the overall saving made. The marketing will be updated in the canteen to reflect the changes and the Catering Staff will be on hand to advise students on the offer. The Meal Deal price is still within the free school meal allowance and we hope that students will feel encouraged to use this.

### NEW 3 WEEK MENU

Aspens have been working with a Development Chef to create new menus which will be going live after the February Half term. The menus change weekly and work on a three week cycle, they offer a range of healthy options for students to choose from. Aspens met with the student councils last year and have used their feedback in the menu development. Going forward we are pleased to announce that all of the vegetarian options on the new menus will be vegan. We hope that students enjoy the new menus on offer and would like to encourage students to provide the Catering Team with feedback.

To try and minimise disruption, these changes will all be coming into effect on the  $22^{nd}$  of February (21<sup>st</sup> February is an INSET day) when the students return form their half term break. We have attached a document which sets out the new weekly menus, the revised tariff sheet and what students can expect from their meal deals.


