Young Carers Action Day -Wednesday 13th March 2024




Wednesday 13th March – a day to raise awareness of the UK's young carers. Young Carers are children and young people under the age of 18, who care for a family member with a long-term physical or mental illness or disability, misuse substance or have an additional need.

This year's focus is on ensuring Fair Futures for young carers. Carers Trusts' 2023 Young Carers' Survey showed ONE in THREE young carers struggle to balance caring with education, this can have a big impact on whether they can get on at school, go to university, or get a job or an apprenticeship.

Book Signing for World Book Day

Last Monday for World Book Day we had a visit from Faridah Abíké-Íyímídé, author of "Ace of Spades," who came to talk to us about how her writing experiences as well as her personal experiences which influenced the stories she has written. A recently published novel by Faridah Abíké-Íyímídé, "Where Sleeping Girls Lie", explores the importance of friendships through loveable characters, such as Muffin the guinea pig, whilst simultaneously discussing serious topics like sexual abuse. As a Black woman, she places a high value on seeing herself and others represented in her stories to ensure that others like her feel as if they are a protagonist in their own life. By tackling themes such as institutional racism, she highlights the importance of speaking up and drawing attention to these issues as they arise. Faridah Abíké-Íyímídé wrote "Ace of Spades" while she was studying at the University of Aberdeen, where she first faced microaggressions. She describes the writing experience as a "therapy for herself", a means of processing her bad experiences. Studying in Aberdeen had influenced her writing for several reasons; previously having gone to a very diverse all-girls school in Croydon, moving to a predominantly white institution for university made her feel marginalised, causing her to use her writing as an outlet for the emotions she had felt due to the discrimination. Furthermore, as a Muslim, she did find herself aligning with the drinking culture at the university – this served as the beginning for her friendship with author Adiba Jaigirdar and resulted in them writing the upcoming novel "Four Eids And A Funeral" together. They wanted to show the Muslim community in a positive light and as a very diverse group, accurate to the real world. Faridah shared tips from her journey, as a well-accomplished author, that enabled her to achieve a successful book deal. It was amazing to hear how she was able to land an agent at the age of 19! Her story was truly inspiring for the budding readers and writers in the room.

Sophia McCart, a student at Wallington High School for Girls, recently emerged as the winner at the Sutton Regional Final of Jack Petchey's Speak Out Challenge. This event is the largest public speaking programme in England, managed and delivered by Speakers Trust, the UK's leading public speaking charity. The programme is supported and funded by the Jack Petchey Foundation, with the aim of amplifying young people's voices by building confidence, developing skills, and creating platforms for them to share their stories and ideas.

Sophia McCart's winning speech, titled "Take Care of Today", encouraged her audience to live in the present, embrace change, and pursue their passions. McCart emphasised that it's okay to alter life goals as they evolve, and that the best decisions are those made in the moment for the individual's current well-being.

The Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge provides free communication skills training to Year 10 students in every state school in London and Essex. Through these workshops, over 30,000 young people are empowered each year.

Following her win, McCart expressed gratitude and admiration for her fellow competitors. "I'm just so





grateful that I won," she said. "I think everyone else there did such an amazing job. Everyone was just so strong and deserves this so much. Their speeches were amazing."

Sophia McCart's victory at the Sutton Regional Final is a testament to the power of effective, positive communication in education, employability, and social change. It also highlights the importance of programmes like the Jack Petchey Speak Out Challenge in nurturing the voices of the next generation.

We are incredibly proud of Sophia's achievement and look forward to seeing her continue to use her voice to effect positive change in society. Congratulations, Sophia!




