MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER



There have been many fantastic school events recently, and it has been great that so many parents have attended. I know it is not always possible with work and family commitments, but it shows real support when parents can attend such things.

Extra-curricular clubs are in full swing, please check in with your daughter and ask what they have signed up for. Year 7 have started to receive homework, please keep an eye on how much time they are spending on this work, it is important that all young people get some down time and family time too!

As in every school we have a large number of unidentified student items building up such as PE bags, pencil cases and even whole PE kits! Please label all your daughters' belongings.

We had an upset email from a local resident this week about the parking of some of our parents at the start and end of the school day. They were understandably upset and wrote that they live very close to the school and have heard several complaints regarding parents at Wallington Girls blocking access into and out of the flats and blocking some roads. They explained that our parents are parking on the double yellow lines and impeding driver views when pulling into/out of private driveways. They pointed out that locally there are several vulnerable residents who need constant access to their homes, so we are putting people at risk. Can I thank all of you who adhere to the road laws and park sensibly, but I also ask that all parents who drop off and pick up their children consider the local parking restrictions. If the situation does not improve, we will have to ask the council for additional support from parking officers.

Wallington High School for Girls' approach to mental health and behaviour is part of a consistent whole school approach which involves providing a structured school environment with clear expectations of behaviour, well communicated social norms and routines, which are reinforced with highly consistent consequence systems. This is paired with an individualised graduated response in the form of our Social, Emotional and Mental Health Provision Map which can be found in our Mental Health Policy on our website. We believe it is important that children are provided with support as soon as a problem emerges, at any point in their life. YEAR 13 INTERVIEW DAY

Event: Year 13 Interview Day

We are organising a special event for our year 13 students and are looking for volunteers to join us to help them develop a crucial life skill: interviewing.

Interviewing is a crucial life skill that goes beyond just job applications. It's about effective communication, self-presentation, and confidence-building. For many of our Year 13 students, this will be their first opportunity to experience a formal interview setting and as you will appreciate, this is an important skill to learn to give our students the confidence and a competitive edge when applying for higher education, apprenticeships or other employment opportunities in the future.

We require volunteers from all sectors but we have a particular need for veterinarians, medical professionals, architects, and individuals with a background in foreign languages.

What to expect:

We are seeking volunteers to conduct multiple 30 minute face-to-face practice interviews. Your role will involve asking questions, providing feedback, and sharing your insights and experiences. Where possible we will match your specialism to an appropriate student but we may also ask you to conduct a generic interview or one broadly related to your field. We are happy for you to use your own questions but you will also be supplied with examples to assist you. We are hoping for volunteers to attend the whole day, however we would still welcome your participation if you are only available for part of the day. Lunch and refreshments will be provided, and for some this may also be a great opportunity to network with other professionals in the local area.

SAMSUNG KIDS PARENTAL CONTROLS

Samsung Kids is a parental feature which you can set up on your child's device which can be used to apply restrictions such as app access, downloading, screen time, privacy and more. It's really easy to set up and use and will help you to manage your child's online activity. Please see the attached flyer.

SOCIAL MEDIA SAFEGUARDING CONCERNS

With children spending more and more time online it is important parents and carers understand the risks associated with social media platforms. Please see the attached posters for more information.

FIRST AID ROOM

If your child has a cold and comes into school they should be able to manage their own symptoms as we do not keep pain relief such as; paracetamol, throat lozenges or any other kind of medication in the first aid room other than those stored for individual students.

The first aid room is the last port of call for students feeling unwell and they may be sent back to lessons if they are deemed fit to attend. However, if your child is feeling unwell at school they should tell their teacher who will assess and send students via reception to the first aid room. On arrival they will be assessed by a first aider and if they feel the student is not well enough to remain in school, they will ring a parent/carer to collect the student.

Students should, under no circumstances, phone a parent/carer themselves to inform them they are unwell.

A reminder that if your child has been suffering from vomiting/diarrhoea, they should not come into school for at least 48 hours, of no symptoms, to prevent the spread of infection to others. Our aim is to keep students healthy, resilient and prevent the spread of infection to students and staff.

PÄDAGOGISCHER AUSTAUSCHDIENST - PROMOTING INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE AND COOPERATION IN THE SCHOOL SECTOR

During the summer, two of our A Level German students, Lucia and Noureen, took part in a programme organised by the Pädagogischer Austauschdienst (the national agency in Germany working to promote international exchange and cooperation in the school sector). Lucia won a place on the Scholarship Programme, which encompassed a fully-funded stay of four weeks including visits to major cities and a stay with a host family. Noureen was selected for the 2-week German Pupil Course, which provided subsidised language tuition and cultural visits. Both students had a fantastic time, getting first-hand experience of German life and culture and immersing themselves in the German language. They will now carry out a Primary School Ambassadors Project in the autumn term, in order to share their knowledge and experience with younger pupils. The organisers described them both as "wonderful ambassadors for the UK", and we are very proud that their applications were successful in the face of stiff international competition.

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
