MESSAGE FROM The Headteacher



Do we prepare students for medical school – yes, we do! We recently held a round of Mini Medical Interviews for all Year 13 applicants, 48 students in total who are applying for medicine, dentistry and veterinary science. Students had a series of 5-minute interviews, in which many skills were tested. This included their ability to think critically and ethically about scenarios as well as

activities to test their manual dexterity and ability to break bad news. This was invaluable practice for our students with interview season around the corner. A huge thanks to the 16 external volunteers we had from our parent body and alumni who gave up their time to facilitate this event. This was only one event of many that help prepare our students for the rigorous application and interview process. We are very proud of our careers offer that helps prepare all our students for their own individual chosen pathways. In fact, Year 9 students have already had their first assembly about option choices.

I know some of you, especially those of you with children in Year 7, are understandably concerned about your child's safety on their journeys to and from school, but I would like to reassure you that once they are here, we have very robust systems which ensure their attendance is monitored throughout the day. The reception team work very hard dealing with lots of parent phone calls and concerns, but please understand that they will contact you if any issues arise.

We are currently recruiting for our Parent Focus Group; a consultative group which plays a significant role in supporting the school in implementing and evaluating procedures and new initiatives. YEAR 13 INTERVIEW DAY

Event: Year 13 Interview Day Date: Wednesday 22nd November 2023 Location: Wallington High School for Girls Time: 9:30 – 15:00

We are organising a special event for our year 13 students and are looking for volunteers to join us to help them develop a crucial life skill: interviewing.

Interviewing is a crucial life skill that goes beyond just job applications. It's about effective communication, self-presentation, and confidence-building. For many of our Year 13 students, this will be their first opportunity to experience a formal interview setting and as you will appreciate, this is an important skill to learn to give our students the confidence and a competitive edge when applying for higher education, apprenticeships or other employment opportunities in the future.

We require volunteers from all sectors but we have a particular need for veterinarians, medical professionals, architects, and individuals with a background in foreign languages.

What to expect:

We are seeking volunteers to conduct multiple 30 minute face-to-face practice interviews. Your role will involve asking questions, providing feedback, and sharing your insights and experiences. Where possible we will match your specialism to an appropriate student but we may also ask you to conduct a generic interview or one broadly related to your field. We are happy for you to use your own questions but you will also be supplied with examples to assist you. We are hoping for volunteers to attend the whole day, however we would still welcome your participation if you are only available for part of the day. Lunch and refreshments will be provided, and for some this may also be a great opportunity to network with other professionals in the local area.

SCHOOL GOVERNOR VACANCY

You should have received a notification earlier in the week about a vacancy for a school governor.

If you would like to contribute to shaping the future of our school, the governors encourage you to consider nominating yourself to stand as a parent governor. They will welcome nominations from any interested parent/carer.

Nominations for the vacancy should be made by completing a response in the form below:

Parent Governor Nominations

The response must have a personal statement of no more than 200 words setting out why you want to be a governor and what you would bring to the role. This personal statement will be circulated to all parents /carers if a ballot has to be arranged. A ballet will be arranged if there are two or more applicants.

Nominees must also confirm that they are willing to undergo a DBS check (Disclosure and Barring Service, previously CRB) and that they are not prohibited from acting as a company director.

The closing date for applications is the 5th November 2023 by 12 noon.

Duke of Edinburgh Launch 2023

We are hosting a parents' information evening for any students in Y9, 10, 12 who would like more information regarding the Duke of Edinburgh award at any level (bronze, silver and gold).

Parents of students who have previously taken part in the D of E do not need to attend unless they wish to do so.

Details: Tuesday 17th October 2023 @ 5-6 pm in the school hall.

Please can we ask that only one parent/carer attends with their child on this evening so that we can manage numbers and avoid overcrowding. Please be assured that all information will be made available on our website should you not be able to attend.

What is the Duke of Edinburgh Award?

The Duke of Edinburgh scheme enables a young person to elevate their self-confidence, skills and aspirations in a non-competitive environment. Employers have named the Award as the highest non-academic accolade they look for in prospective employees.

Students who enrol on the scheme will undertake four sections: Volunteering, Physical, Skills and an Expedition. For those students who wish to take part in the Gold scheme, there is also an additional Residential section. Each section must be done for a minimum period of time, which increases between the Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. The Bronze award is open to Year 9. The Silver and Gold awards are open to all students in Years 10 and 12 respectively, regardless of whether they have completed any previous levels.

WHSG is a directly licensed centre which is supported by the operations team at London DofE. This means that we will coordinate the Volunteering, Physical and Skills sections in school and using an online portal. Activ Adventures, who have worked with WHSG and Nonsuch for the past four years, run the expedition section with training sessions in school. Alternatively, students may choose to join an open expedition run by London DofE or use another provider.

Bronze: For students in Year 9 and above. Enrolment fee of $\pounds 35.50 + expedition cost.$ **Silver:** For students in Year 10 and above. Enrolment fee of $\pounds 35.50 + expedition cost.$ **Gold:** For students in Lower Sixth. Enrolment fee of $\pounds 42.50 + expedition cost.$
