Work Experience: Year 11 8th - 12th July 2024/ Year 12 15th - 19th July 2024

Every pupil should have first-hand experiences of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing and/or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities, and expand their networks. Effective work experience can make a significant difference to the motivation, attainment and progression of students. However, finding a placement can often be a daunting task and so we would appreciate your support in helping your child to find a suitable experience.

Please would year 11 and 12 parents and carers spend some time exploring any contacts which your child can use and help them to explore and research local companies who may be able to provide a placement.

Medical Appointments

If your child needs to leave school early for a planned medical appointment, parents /carers need to email the attendance address (below) at least 48 hours in advance. Students need to inform their Form Tutor in the morning, then the relevant subject teacher if they need to leave a lesson early. Students must report to reception when leaving the premises where they will receive an out of school pass.

If your child returns to school on the same day, they must report to reception on arrival in order to sign in. If there is an emergency medical appointment, parents/carers should email the attendance address by 8.45am on the day.

Students' Medications at School

If any student has a condition that requires medication such as Adrenaline Auto Injectors, Antihistamines or Inhalers, parents and carers must ensure that we are provided with a spare to be kept in the first aid room. **This is in addition to medication carried by the student.**

*Medication will be required for the upcoming Enrichment Activities and should be provided before that date/if you are notified of a medication request via email.

We require all medication to be supplied in its original container with leaflet, accompanied by a completed <u>Parental Permission Form</u>.

We would also ask that you would provide the school with replacements prior to the expiry date being reached.

The medication will be stored in the First Aid Room and given to your child as detailed on the Parental Permission Form.

The pair shaped and inspired a young and inexperienced team admirably since they started training in September.

The Wilson's team were disappointed not to bring any silverware home. But after reflecting on their 5th place in The Nationals they should be proud of their hard work and efforts. They came a creditable 2nd in First Aid, their highest ever finish in this discipline and 3rd in Air Recce. Congratulations to Loughborough who won the Trophy and all the teams for setting such high standards. Thanks to the staff and volunteers who make this excellent so rewarding and challenging for the cadets and to special mention to our friends and rivals from Dulwich College for making the coach journey home such an enjoyable, sing-along, part of the day.

A mammoth effort by Cadets and Adult volunteers, not to mention the Thursday evenings and days at the weekend that the team and staff have put in in the build up to the event.
