MESSAGE FROM The Headteacher

This week our Year 12 students participated in a Personal Statement Day, where they spent time with their form tutors to delve into the UCAS process. This day provided them with valuable insights into the university application journey and allowed them to start shaping their aspirations for the future. It was a productive session, and I appreciate the effort put in by both our students and their form tutors.

This week also marked the beginning of the public examinations for Year 11 and Year 13 who have shown a really positive attitude so far. Hopefully, now that the first exams have taken place some nerves will start to fade. In an effort to prepare our Year 7 and Year 8 students for their upcoming end-of-year exams next week, Mr. Donnelly spoke to them in assembly this week. He offered advice and guidance to help them approach their exams and revision. For his assembly with Years 9, 10 and 12, Mr Donnelly engaged students in a series of thought experiments about the philosophy of mind, challenging them to think about the rise of AI, the nature of consciousness, and what this all may mean for humanity.

Additionally, we have recently received some complaints from local residents regarding the behaviour of a small minority of our students outside of school and on the buses. It is important that students are mindful of their surroundings and demonstrate respectful conduct to others in the community. I would be very grateful if you are able to reinforce these expectations at home.

As we expect the weather to be warmer next week, we will be reminding students that jumpers are an optional part of the school uniform. Blazers should still be worn, although can be removed with a teacher's permission in lesson and shirts should still be tucked in. We will be keeping a close eye on the weather over the coming weeks and review our uniform if it gets very hot at any point in this summer term. Please send your child into school with a refillable water bottle to use throughout the day and encourage them to apply sun cream if they are choosing to use the outdoor spaces at lunchtime.

The Year 12 Personal Statement Day buzzed with activity as students immersed themselves in workshops and sessions designed to refine their personal statements and articulate their unique stories.

CAREER SPOTLIGHT Occupational Therapy

CLIPS

OTs work with people who have difficulties with everyday living - possibly from birth, or caused through illness, accident, the ageing process or by the environment in which they live.

OTs may help people rehabilitate from an accident or illness or support them to find ways of managing their problems, so that they can become as independent as possible and more fully participate in daily activities. They may also help clients to recover their social skills and motivate them to rebuild their self-confidence.

OTs carry out assessments to determine how well their clients function physically, socially and psychologically and identify any areas where they need help.

The OT sets goals with the client and prepares an individualised treatment plan.


